

Pech-Maho. Commercial transaction on lead tablet

Description: fragmentary rectangular bronze plaque written on both sides: the Greek text on the recto followed the Etruscan inscription engraved on the verso (dimensions: h:52 w:115 d:1,1). The plaque was rolled up with the receiver's name written along the verso's right side; the name erased partially the Etruscan text

Layout: almost stoichedon (ca. 29 letters)

Letters: Phocaeen alphabet

Origin: a Ionic settlement in Iberic area.

Dating: 475-450 BC

Findspot: Sigean (Pech-Maho oppidum), France

Current location: ?
